Ministry & Life Perspectives



From Safari.....

As I write a tentative peace has come between Israel and Hamas and hope fully to all of the Middle East. Congratulations to President Trump and other world leaders to bring about the cease fire and return of the

living hostages. Through our prayers may lasting peace come to the Middle East.

Our persistence in prayer, recall all the prayers lifted to God for peace in the Middle East, has led to this moment. God's graces softened the hearts of many to accept a path of peace rather than violence.

Persistence is a word which weaves its way through our readings today. As long as Moses raised his arms in prayer, the army of Israel was successful. The writer of 2 Timothy encourages Timothy to be persistent in his life, finding guidance in the scriptures. Jesus encourages the disciples to be persistent in prayer.

On first read of the parable of the judge and widow, there is a risk of leaving in our minds an unhelpful image of prayer. It can give us an image like this--- When you pray think of yourself as the biggest pest possible with God, keep yourself in God's face until you get what you feel is important, fills your needs.

This is not the image Luke intends. Luke's Gospel has often been called the Gospel of Prayer. Throughout the gospel Jesus is found in prayer at the most important moments in his life. The image of persistence for Luke is being in God's presence, praying always, and trusting in God.

To pray always is to make our entire life a prayer. This kind of prayer involves offering ourselves, all we have and do, to the service of God. It is bringing ourselves before God throughout the day.

Ministry & Life Perspectives (cont.)

To pray always can be difficult. It is easy sometimes to grow weary in prayer. Weariness sets in when we let hope fade. The answers we look for are many: we may be praying to be healed of illness. We may be contemplating the events of our life, seeking understanding. We may be praying for strength or courage. We may simply be seeking the peace of God's presence. And when answers don't seem to come, we can grow weary. We wonder if anyone is there. We wonder if it's us --- if we're not worthy of God's attention. Our weariness arises as we trust in ourselves, seek our own will. It is in these moments, like Moses, we need help in praying. God gives us the gift of the Holy Spirit. That gift includes wisdom, courage, strength, assurance, and goodness. All gifts that we need in times of stress, despair, and doubt.

Persistence in prayer requires believing that God's plan is better than anything we might conjure for ourselves. God's answer are profound and utterly amazing.

Lord, as I pray today, may all become what you intend. Fr. Ron

Cold Nights, Warm Hearts Winter Shelter 2025

To address shelter and the upcoming winter, Faith in Housing, a local group working on homelessness and housing, is recruiting volunteers and financial assistance for sheltering people from the cold this winter. Last winter there were close to 40 people on the streets each night. To accommodate those on the streets this year, Place of Hope and Salvation Army will again be hosting guests from 6 pm-8:00 am each night. In order to provide this service, Faith in Housing is calling upon our area community to offer assistance. Volunteers are needed for things such as transportation, serving meals, handing out breakfast bags, supervision and preparation of the sites. Two opportunities will be offered for information and training on Monday, October 20th, 6:30-8:30 pm OR Thursday, October 23rd from 10-Noon. Both trainings will be at the Place of Hope on 511 9th Ave N, St. Cloud.

Volunteers must be 18 years of age or older. Younger volunteers must be accompanied by an adult. For more information contact: faithinhousing@gmail.com or Place of Hope at 320-203-7881. It costs about \$40 for a mat and \$25 per night to house a guest. If you'd like to donate you can send a check made out to one of the three shelters; Place of Hope, Homeless Helping Homeless or Salvation Army to Atonement Lutheran Church, 1144 29th Ave N, St. Cloud, MN 56303. Please designate Cold Nights, Warm Hearts Winter Shelter in the memo and on the envelope.
