## **Ministry & Life Perspectives**



What's the Latest with All Things New?
Thank you for your participation in the surveys we have sent out, the Town Halls, and the many individual conversations that take place around our future as parish communities and as a diocese.
Your One in Christ Planning Committee continues

to meet both in four subgroups (Mass schedule; governance; finance and programs; parish culture) and as a whole committee.

Additionally, they participate in the Metro Area Deanery large group meetings presented by the diocesan Office of Planning.

What have all those meetings accomplished?

The Planning Committee is taking the proposals from our four subgroups and will create a first draft of our ACC plan in the next 2 weeks or so. We will then present this draft in second Town Hall meetings for your awareness and further input. We will refine our ACC plan and submit it to the Office of Planning to get on the schedule of the diocesan "CAP" (Committee for the Affirmation of Plans) and receive their analysis. If refinements are needed, the Planning Committee will integrate those into an updated draft. To be clear, we still intend to keep all four sites open as part of our proposal, used for Mass each weekend.

We hope to submit our plan some time in November, before the December 31 deadline. Watch the bulletin, FaceBook, and Flocknote for information on the Town Halls.

Please remember that our plan, as with every ACC, is a proposal. None of it is "official" until it is approved by Bishop Neary in collaboration with his advisors. It was recently determined (wisely, I think) that no plan will be formally approved until all the 29 ACCs have submitted their plans. The logic behind this is to allow an overall picture of the diocesan future to emerge and so any overlaps, gaps, or conflicting plans relative to the Guiding Principles and the Design Parameters can be addressed and aligned.

#### Speaking of Hope ...

Recently I read a hopeful interview with someone you perhaps have never heard of: Cardinal François Bustillo, Bishop of Ajaccio (on the isle of Corsica). His book Reparacion (Reparation) speaks to how Catholic values will help to humanize society again. Excerpts below: We live in a society where acts of violence and harshness are on the rise, where people judge without having all the facts at their disposal. It's essential to step back, to cultivate a certain modesty, and to evaluate carefully before speaking out.

We Christians can offer this perspective, following the example of the monastic tradition: valuing silence, detaching ourselves from immediate emotions, avoiding impulsive reactions, and seeking the right words to say.

## Ministry & Life Perspectives (cont.)

Our world can still proclaim great values, but in reality, we can be harsh, indifferent, selfish, and individualistic. ... Our pace is frenetic, and our attention is constantly being solicited. But without rest, without silence, how can we reflect and discern? It's not a question of idleness, but of finding moments of pause. The monastic tradition values silence and recollection. Today, we're pushed to react immediately: "Are you for or against this? Do you like it or not?"

Everyone can organize their time to preserve moments of calm. This could be meditation, a visit to a church, or a time of reflection. These breaks repair our inner selves, which have been damaged by an overstimulated exterior.

In order to discern accurately, it's vital not to live solely according to the logic of power, having, and doing, but also to take care of being. And it is in silence that we find our deepest identity. "Loving our enemy" is Christ's most powerful and most difficult teaching. This is the only way to break with the logic of revenge and violence. ... Christ doesn't ask for immediate results, but for an inner openness so that our heart doesn't remain imprisoned by the evil we've received. Through forgiveness and love—the two lungs of the Christian—we breathe again. Without this effort, pain imprisons us and leaves us in darkness. With forgiveness and love, we move toward inner freedom.

In a society quick to denounce and criticize, it's essential that voices be raised to recognize what is beautiful and good. In affirming the good, rather than just criticizing the bad, we are bearing witness to what is beautiful, moving, and constructive, learning to celebrate what deserves to be recognized, and thus sowing life and hope.
