Ministry & Life Perspectives



From Safari.....

"How long, O Lord? I cry for help but you do not listen!" There is a timelessness to Habakkuk's lament. Habakkuk lived around the 600 BC. The world in which he lived was

in turmoil. Many Hebrew people were not taking God's word seriously in their lives. On the horizon, there was fear of an impending invasion by the Babylonians.

Many of us can identify with Habakkuk's lament. All around us we see tragedy, ruin, misery. Among the miseries are the many assaults on the dignity of life in our culture, including abortion, physical and emotional abuse, war, gun violence, euthanasia, capital punishment, poverty, acts of discrimination, destruction of the environment, and more. Like Habakkuk we ask, "How can God allow such injustices? Where is God?"He asks those questions not because he has doubt in God but because of his faith. Habakkuk waited for God's reply. God did reply. He asked Habakkuk to write down the message down on tablets, most likely stone, in large print, to stress its permanence and to be read more easily. God's answer, "Wait for the appointed time, good will be rewarded and evil punished; have faith."

It is not a very satisfying answer. We want to know the whens and the hows of better days. Let's put it on the calendar. Midst all the uncertainty, we are challenged to live as Saturday people who know Sunday is coming. Jesus' resurrection forever changed Saturday. Pain, misery, and injustice will not last. God's love will always triumph.

Faith is God's gift to us, to enable us to live in Saturday with the hope of Sunday. Some scholars, studying our passage from Luke, suggest that Jesus was affirming that the disciples already had the faith to do what is expected of them. It they would believe and act on the faith that they already have they can forgive, love, and bring up change in the community. They don't need more faith, but to make use of the faith that is already within them.


Ministry & Life Perspectives (cont.)

There is an old prayer which prays, "O God, I don't pray for enough faith to move mountains. I can get enough dynamite and bulldozers to do that. What I need and ask for is enough faith to move me." Perhaps that is where you and I are, especially as we look at the challenges in our world and lives. Let us ask God to move us. To take the risk and allow God to lead us.

In the Letter of Timothy, the writer reminds Timothy we did not receive a spirit of cowardice, but rather of love and power. Let the Spirit to stir you, and through you, God will work. For faith is not our own power or our own wisdom but believing in the power and wisdom of God.

October is traditionally considered Respect Life month. May the power and wisdom of God strengthen us to stand up for the sacredness life from conception through natural death in our words and our deeds.
