# **Ministry & Life Perspectives**



As you recall, the theme for this Jubilee Year 2025 is "Pilgrims of Hope." Opened by Pope Francis on Christmas Eve, 2024, and locally at St. Mary's Cathedral on December 28, this theme and the need for a Year of Hope could not be more providential, as the hope of so many people is sorely tried by the events of the world.

We have seen tragic violence with the shootings of children at Mass and political figures across the spectrum of viewpoints. Wars continue in the Middle East and Ukraine, with growing religious oppression and violence in Nigeria, Venezuela, North Korea, Pakistan, and elsewhere. Communities, families, and individual lives are upended by arrest, separations, and deportation of immigrant populations. Prices rise, jobs are lost, diocesan parishes discuss their future. The Pope who opened the Jubilee died just a few months into it, and Pope Leo faces enormous challenges in a world so wounded by despair.

As we observe Masses of Suicide Remembrance and Healing around our Diocese this weekend, we recall too how sorrow and suffering visit so often and so personally for countless families.

The catalog of profound sorrows, insoluble problems, and flaring tensions could be extended greatly; these are but examples. I mention these not to escalate the polarization and crisis of hope afflicting our times, but to point to why we need to implore the gift of that virtue from the Holy Spirit.

As the Church makes its pilgrimage through time, we occasionally observe a "Jubilee Year" as a holy time especially focused on the forgiveness of sins, the call to conversion, and our hope in the return of Jesus as the ultimate goal of history. In calling for this Year, Pope Francis wrote: The coming Jubilee will thus be a Holy Year marked by the hope that does not fade, our hope in God. May it help us to recover the confident trust that we require, in the Church and in society, in our interpersonal relationships, in international relations, and in our task of promoting the dignity of all persons and respect for God's gift of creation.

The Jubilee remains an observance that points us to new beginnings. Things do not need to continue as they are, if we return to the Covenant God makes for a future full of hope.

By the time you read this, the 40+ pilgrims from our ACC will have returned from our brief but rich travels to four of the diocesan Jubilee Year of Hope sites. We did some trivia questions on the bus; I include some of them here, with the answers below.

But a pilgrimage is never trivial. It is an intentional visit to a holy place to meet God. Each of these sites was new at some point, an inspired initiative to respond to the call of Christ to trust, to serve, to pray, to sacrifice for others.

Whatever tests your hope today, pray the words St. Faustina heard almost 100 years from Christ: <u>Jesus, I trust in you</u>. Keep praying this until you experience it as true in your heart of hearts. As St. Paul assures us: Hope does not disappoint.
